	The Teacher Education Committee (TEC) reviews all applicants and judges their suitability for entrance to the program during the student's sophomore year. Judgment of this suitability is based on the following:
	1. Formal application for admission to the TEP, including completion of a writing component, submitted by the deadline posted in the Education Bay. This must be completed during the sophomore year. If you have any questions, please

- see the secretary or Chair of the Education Department. (Students who decide to seek teacher certification after the sophomore year can be admitted late but may require extra time to complete the program.)
- 2. A cumulative Grade Point Average of at least 2.75 and evidence of proficiency in basic writing and mathematics skills. Proficiency is a grade of 'C' or above in ENG 101 and MTH 101 or placement in a course beyond 101 via placement test.
- 3. Passing scores on the Michigan Professional Readiness Exam or Equivalent Passing Scores.
- 4. Evidence that the student is making an effort to acquire competence in the humanities, natural sciences and social sciences
- 5. Evidence that the applicant has personal characteristics conducive to success in the teaching profession.

Good standing (not on academic, social or administrative probation).

### Alma College Basis for Admission

To be considered for admission to Alma, high school students should have (1) approximately a "B" average, (2) an ACT composite score of 22 or a combined SAT score of 1030 and (3) made progress toward a total of 16 academic units which must include a minimum of four years of English, three years of mathematics, three years of social studies and three years of science. In addition, at least two years of one foreign language are strongly recommended. Students who do not meet these requirements are considered individually for admission. All applicants are considered on the basis of their academic and

	test records.
