### **Training Credit**

To receive training credit for in-person sessions attended, you must be pre-registered for each individual session. To pre-register for your desired sessions in the app, click on the Agenda, click on the session you want to attend, and click 'Reserve Seat.' If the session is full, you will not be permitted to reserve a seat, receive training credit, or enter the room.

You may switch your reserved sessions using the app as needed. Keep in mind, you can only receive training credit for sessions you have reserved in the app. At the conclusion of each session, the presenter will provide you with a Check Out code. Enter the code in the session on the app to receive training credit.

To receive MiRegistry training credit, you must have included your MiRegistry ID Number during registration. To receive SCHECHs for those eligible, you must have included your PIC Number during registration.

Training sessions completed may take up to 30 days to appear in your MiRegistry Learning Record. Online sessions may take up to 48 business hours to appear on your MiRegistry Learning Record. SCHECHs may take up to 30 days to appear on your MOECS account regardless of session format.




